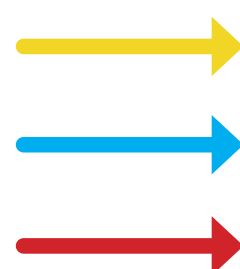


WHAT NEXT FOR PUBLIC REALM IN LOUGHBOROUGH JUNCTION?

In June and July we asked local people how we could improve the public spaces in Loughborough Junction. A huge thank you to the 297 adults and the 84 local school children from Jessops and St Saviours who gave us their time to provide feedback, and help us to prioritise the steering group's ideas.

LOCAL PEOPLE'S TOP 3 PRIORITIES



CELEBRATE THE AREA'S IDENTITY
IMPROVE THE STREETS & ROADS

SOME OF THESE PRIORITIES WILL BE REALISED BY APRIL 2017*:

LAMP- POST BANNERS

(Jan 2017) celebrating local history and creativity will go up around the junction. We have been working on artwork with **Jessops Primary, St Saviours, Loughborough School, Evelyn Grace & Michael Tippett School.**

DECORATING THE BRIDGE

(March 2017)

The bridge on Loughborough Road will be redecorated with lettering, artwork and new lighting - **involving local schools, artists and the 7 bridges project.**

ARTWORK ON THE GREEN MAN

(Feb 2017) kindly funded by Matthew Betts, owner of the building, which will be designed with the help of **Sunshine International Arts.**

PAVEMENT & KERB IMPROVEMENTS

on Coldharbour Lane (March 2017).

THE ENTRANCE TO WYCK GARDENS

(March 2017) will be transformed to provide more and better public space, planting and a focal point for the area.


THE AREA OUTSIDE THE STATION

(March 2017) will have a pedestrian crossing point added to it, and the road surface will be improved. Additional seating and planting will be added later in the year.

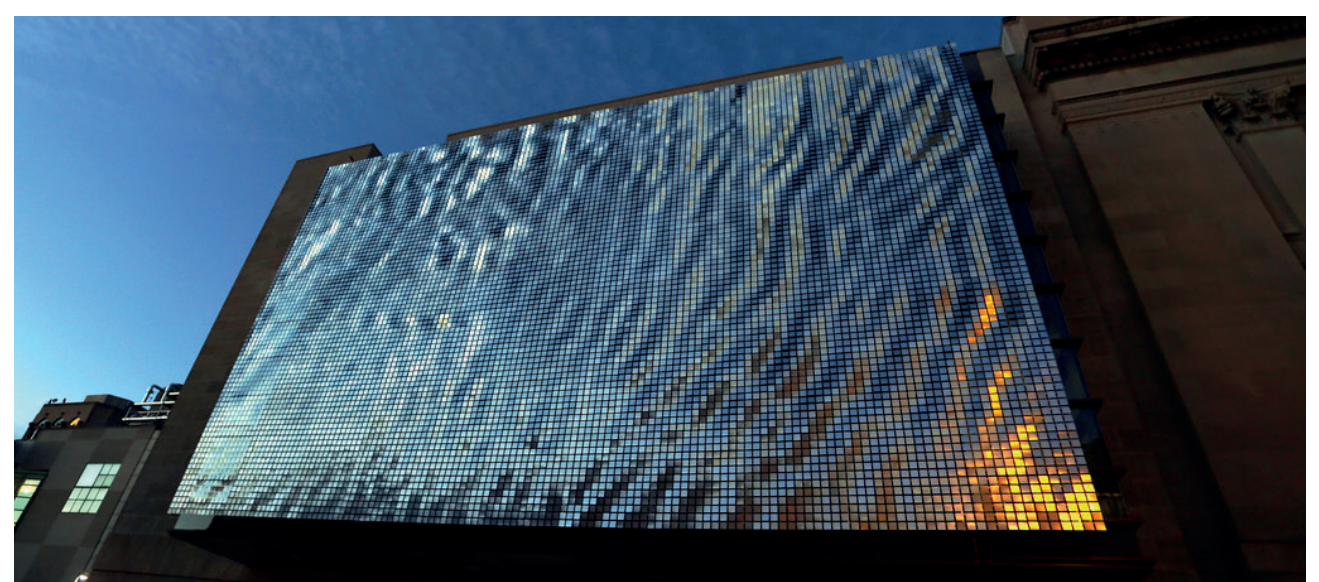
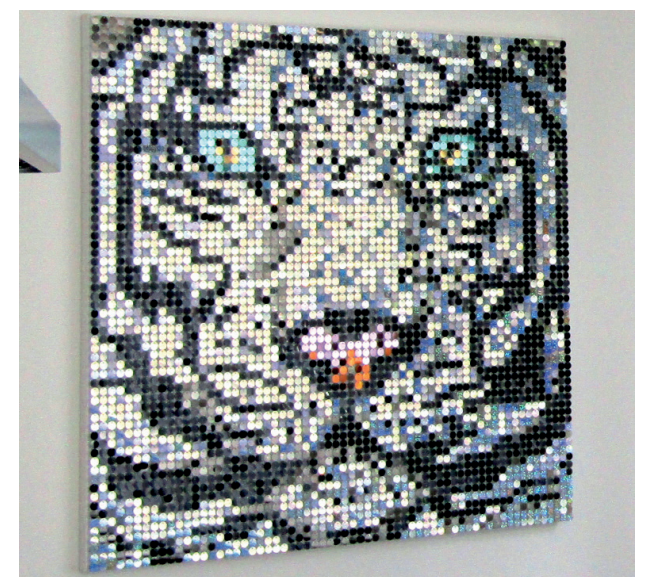
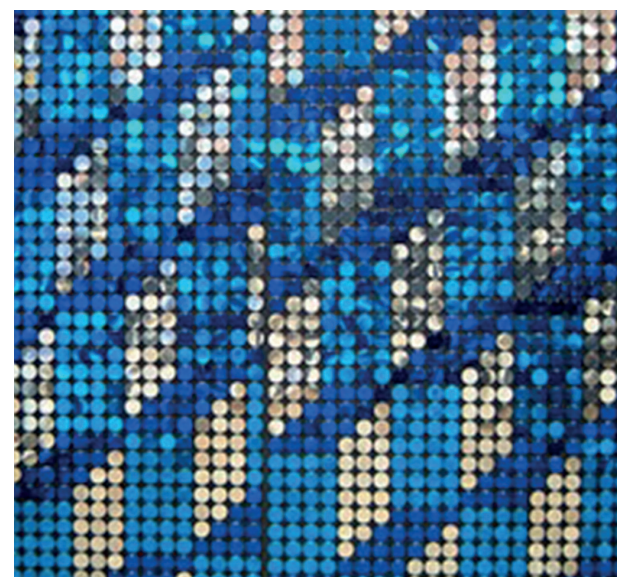

PUBLIC ART ON THE GREEN MAN

Architecture and design studio make:good in collaboration with ***Sunshine International Arts*** and the people of Loughborough Junction will be developing a design for a shimmer wall. ***The final design will be displayed on the Green Man Skills Zone building.***



Shimmer walls are made up of hundreds of small, highly reflective discs, arranged to create a picture, pattern or message. They catch ambient light and ripple in the wind, making them a great way of adding character, light and movement. ***Check out these great examples:***



This piece of public art work is being generously funded by Matthew Betts, owner of the Green Man Building as part of the public realm improvements.

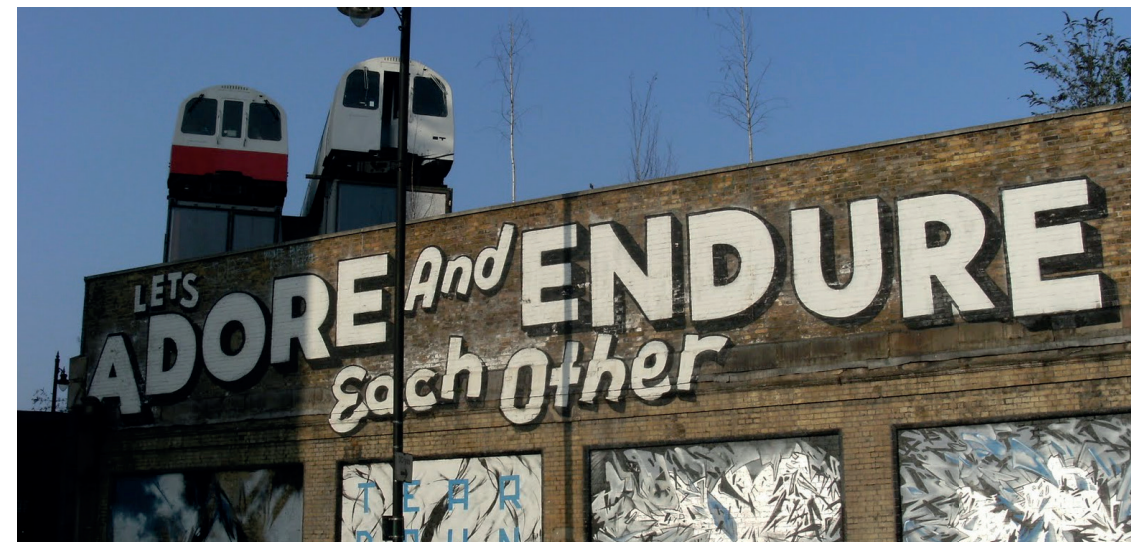
LETTERING ON THE BRIDGE



make:good and the 7 Bridges Project will be working together to transform the bridge on Loughborough Road. make:good will design lettering for the sides of the bridge and 7 Bridges will be working with artists to create vibrant African inspired art on the underside.

make:good produced the patterned letters (below left) with local schools, these were popular with the people we spoke to in the summer.

We want to capture the essence of these ideas, and align the lettering with the influence of African art that the 7 Bridges project are working on.



We are planning to work with professional signwriters to hand paint the lettering as this will last longer and look better than a vinyl or printed option.

This will mean that the designs may need to be less intricate. We don't know what the lettering will look like, but above are some examples that we like.

On one side of the bridge we are planning to write '**Loughborough Junction**'. For the other side, we really like the idea of using this African proverb:

"If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together."

LAMP POST BANNERS & LOCAL HISTORY



make:good are planning to bring the streets around the junction of Coldharbour Lane and Loughborough Road to life using patterns created with local school children.

The patterns we have been making each relate to a different moment in local history so the banners will end up being something of a Loughborough Junction time-line.

There are lots of interesting facts about the area that we think are worth shouting about - ***Let us know if you know an interesting piece of local history!***



1832 : The Green Man Tea Gardens were located off Coldharbour Lane.



1870 : James Myatt had a farm, which grew rhubarb and strawberries.



1900- Fred Karno opened the Fun
1908 : Factory where Charlie Chaplin & Stan Laurel trained.



1940- More than 119 bombs fell on this
1941 : area during the blitz in WW2.



1948 : Jamaican immigrants arrived on the SS Empire Windrush settling in the area.



Now : The area is truly multi cultural where more than 28 first languages are spoken.
